## **Presidential Candidate Survey Questions**

The candidates' responses reflect whether or not they are in full agreement with each of the following position statements.

- Candidate opposes taxpayer dollars being used to fund abortions and fund groups like Planned Parenthood that provide them.
- 2. Candidate supports the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act, which would provide lifesaving medical care for babies who survive a failed abortion.
- 3. Candidate opposes the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion through all nine months of pregnancy.
- 4. Candidate supports protecting business owners' ability to run their businesses in accordance with Biblical teaching about marriage, family, and sexuality.
- 5. Candidate opposes the "Equality Act," which would remove Americans' religious liberty protections in areas related to sexual orientation and gender identity.
- 6. Candidate supports protecting the right of churches and others holding worship services to meet without undue or discriminatory government restriction.

- 7. Candidate supports prioritizing religious freedom in U.S. foreign policy.
- 8. Candidate opposes allowing students who are biological males and who identify as female to participate in female sports.
- Candidate supports "Interpreting the Constitution as written" as a required philosophy for Federal and Supreme Court judges.
- 10. Candidate supports the decision to move the U.S. Embassy in Israel to Jerusalem.
- 11. Candidate supports providing financial incentives to public education alternatives, including religious schools.
- 12. Candidate supports the recently enacted Criminal Justice Reform legislation.
- 13. Candidate opposes the Green New Deal climate legislation.

## **Federal Candidate Survey Questions**

- Abortion providers, including Planned Parenthood, should not receive taxpayer funds or grants from federal, state, or local governments.
- 2. The Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act, which would provide lifesaving medical care for babies who survive a failed abortion, should be supported.
- Business owners' ability to run their businesses in accordance with Biblical teaching about marriage, family, and sexuality should be protected.
- The "Equality Act," which would add sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression as protected classes in non-discrimination laws, would remove Americans' religious liberty protections and should not be supported.

- 5. Private healthcare insurance should not be eliminated.
- 6. The best way to maintain peace is through a strong military.
- 7. Construction of a wall and other necessary infrastructure on our border is necessary to give complete control over entering and exiting the United States.
- Free enterprise and the right to private property are essential elements of a productive economic system.

## **State Candidate Survey Questions**

- Free enterprise and the right to private property are essential elements of a productive and strong economic system.
- A State of Emergency declaration extended beyond 30 days should depend on the consent of the people of Delaware through the General Assembly.
- 3. Better enforcement of current laws to prevent crime versus more restrictive gun control is needed to protect public safety.
- 4. Delaware laws and statutes should <u>not</u> threaten religious freedom, or the right of individuals, organizations, and businesses to exercise religious conviction and conscience. Lawmakers should oppose all attempts to compel people to compromise their beliefs or retreat from civil and political life as the price for following their faith.
- 5. Delaware law should better define the point of viability of an unborn baby versus allowing the abortion doctor to define it, which is vague and arbitrary (Senate Bill 5, 2017).

- 6. Human life begins at conception and deserves legal protection at every stage until natural death.
- Assisted Suicide, the act of deliberately assisting or cooperating in helping someone terminate his or her life, should <u>not</u> be legalized in Delaware as an end of life option.
- 8. Public schools should <u>not</u> implement expansive and comprehensive sex education curriculum that includes LGBTQ+ sexual experiences, practices, and identities.
- 9. The Delaware Constitution should be amended to protect the right of parents to the control, custody, and care of their children from government interference, which requires the government to prove that it has a strong, compelling reason to restrict that right, such as in cases of abuse and neglect.
